The Jews of Subcarpathian Rus' comprise a unique community. Until their destruction in the Holocaust they lived for centuries peacefully with local Rusyns, Magyars, and other peoples. Subcarpathia never experienced pogroms, and many of its Jews owned and worked their own land as small-scale farmers and lumberjacks. This is the first scholarly history in English of the Subcarpathian Jewry.

The Carpathian Diaspora features:

- 20 chapters that trace the history of Subcarpathian Jews under three regimes: the Habsburg Empire before World War I; Czechoslovakia during the inter-war years; and Hungary during World War II and the Holocaust
- an extensive discussion of the communities in Mukachevo, Uzhhorod, Khust, and Sighet
- insights into the world of Orthodox Jewish piety, Hasidism, and the challenge from Zionism
- a photographic essay on various aspects of Jewish life in the region
- 3 maps, statistical tables, a glossary, bibliography, and index
